

APPLICATION FOR POLICE CLEARANCE

IMPORTANT NOTICE

- Applications for Police Clearances must be submitted in person, if not the form must be notarized by a Notary Public, Justice of the Peace, Attorney-at-Law, Minister of Religion or Police Officer the Rank of Sergeant or above.
- ✓ Applicants 17 years and older must apply in person, if the application is being submitted by a third party it must be notarized by a Notary Public, Justice of the Peace, Attorney-at-Law, Minister or Religion or a Police Officer at the Rank of Sergeant or above.
- ✓ A parent or legal guardian must apply in person and sign on behalf of an applicant below the age of 17 and present documentation (birth certificate/notarized proof of guardianship) to prove such.
- Passport or notarized copies of applicant's passport picture information page and a valid work permit, residency or status stamp must be presented.
- Emergency applications for medical reasons must have official referral from the medical facility.
- Police Clearance required for applicants 13 years and older who are applying for a US Waiver.
- Police Clearance required for applicants 16 years and older who are applying for a US Visa.
- Relevant documents must be provided if there is a change of name through Deed Poll or marriage.
- Identification must be presented for collection.
- All certificates must be collected by the owner. If collected by a third party a notarized letter must be written giving that person permission to collect.
- You must receive a receipt for any transaction.
